525 ADULTS learn how to recognize, react and respond to child sexual abuse by taking Stewards of Children training with SCAN.


1700 INDIVIDUALS attend workshops on trauma, resiliency, and mandated reporting, learning how to protect more children from abuse and neglect.



Professional Development

curriculum and science-based trainings
such as Understanding Adverse
Childhood Experiences, we empower
those on the front lines to recognize
their critical role in prevention.



SCAN's Public Education Program works to change the way our community understands and responds to child abuse and neglect. We manage the Northern Virginia Child Abuse Prevention Campaign, launched each year in April during National Child Abuse Prevention Month. We also facilitate the Allies in Prevention Coalition, a group of more than 100 professionals who share our messaging and campaign tools in diverse communities across the region.
